

ROSEBURG DEFENSIVE PISTOL SAFETY BRIEFING & RSO INTRODUCTIONS

1. OBSERVE THE POSTED CLUB SAFETY RULES & THE FOUR BASIC SAFETY RULES:

1. **ALWAYS** keep the gun pointed in a safe direction. 2. **ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot. 3. **ALWAYS** keep the gun unloaded until ready to use. 4. **ALWAYS** Know your target and what is beyond.

2. ALL GUNS MUST BE HOLSTERED OR IN A BAG UNTIL REACHING THE LOAD AND MAKE READY POINT OR AT THE SAFETY AREA—IN THE PRESENCE OF AN RSO.

3. LOADING OF MAGAZINES/SPEED LOADERS/MOON CLIPS, ETC. IS ALLOWED ANYWHERE ON THE RANGE.

4. KEEP AMMO—WHETHER LOOSE, IN BOXES, MAGAZINES, MOON CLIPS OR SPEED LOADERS—SEPARATE FROM FIREARMS UNTIL ON THE FIRING LINE AND DIRECTED TO “LOAD & MAKE READY” BY THE RSO.

5. EYE & EAR PROTECTION IS REQUIRED TO BE WORN BY BOTH SHOOTERS AND SPECTATORS WHEN THE RANGE IS HOT—“THE RANGE IS HOT, EYES AND EARS PLEASE” IS THE RSO COMMAND.

ONCE THE SHOOTER IS ON THE FIRING LINE

6. FOLLOW THE RANGE SAFETY OFFICERS’ INSTRUCTIONS.

7. OBSERVE THE 180-DEGREE RULE. (EXPLAIN) WHICH IS DEFINED AT:

8. DO NOT LOAD FIREARM UNTIL INSTRUCTED.

9. IF YOU DO NOT UNDERSTAND SOMETHING, PLEASE ASK.

10. ANYONE CAN CALL “CEASE FIRE” AND WHEN YOU HEAR IT—IF ON THE LINE, HOLD YOUR POSITION AND ASSUME THE “LOW-READY” CONDITION. (FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER, FIREARM POINTED DOWNRANGE AND AT THE GROUND APPROXIMATELY 5-TO 10-FEET IN FRONT OF YOU.) IF NOT ON THE LINE, HOLD YOUR POSITION. IN EITHER CASE WAIT FOR FURTHER COMMANDS.

11. WE HAVE TWO SPECIFIC RULES CONCERNING GUN HANDLING AND DROPPING OF A FIREARM:

- A. NO GUN HANDLING OTHER THAN ON THE FIRING LINE OR AT THE SAFETY AREA IN THE PRESENCE OF AN RSO:

1st TIME—RSO WILL REMIND YOU OF OUR HANDLING RULES.

2nd TIME—MAKE FIREARM SAFE AND STORE IT, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOOT ANY MORE THIS DAY.

B. IF YOU DROP YOUR FIREARM—RSO WILL PICK IT UP, SET THE SAFETY AND/OR CLEAR AND MAKE THE FIREARM SAFE AND RETURN IT TO YOU.

1st TIME—RSO WILL ASK IF YOU ARE OK TO CONTINUE.

IF THE DROP OCCURRED DURING A DRAW YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO DRAW ANY MORE THIS DAY—YOU MAY NEED MORE PRACTICE.

2nd TIME—AT THE RSOs DISCRETION, YOU MAY BE REQUIRED TO MAKE YOUR FIREARM SAFE AND STORE IT. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOOT FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE DAY.

- 12. THERE WILL BE NO COACHING ON THE FIRING LINE— ONLY THE SHOOTER AND RSO ALLOWED ON THE FIRING LINE-- SPOUSES, FATHERS, MOTHERS OR OTHERS NOT ALLOWED.**
- 13. IF YOU NEED OR THINK YOU MIGHT NEED SPECIAL INSTRUCTION OR CLARIFICATION, NOTIFY THE CHIEF RSO OR YOUR SQUAD RSO.**
- 14. IN THE PROCESS OF CORRECTING OR INSTRUCTING YOU AS A SHOOTER IT MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE RSO TO TOUCH YOU OR YOUR FIREARM AND, UNLESS IT IS AN EMERGENCY CORRECTION, THEY WILL LIKELY ASK YOUR PERMISSION TO DO SO.**
- 15. DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE, BEYOND THE FIRING LINE, UNTIL THE RANGE IS DECLARED CLEAR BY THE RSO—“THE RANGE IS CLEAR, YOU MAY GO DOWNRANGE TO POLICE BRASS, TAPE AND RESET TARGETS” IS THE RSO COMMAND. WE FIND THAT THE WHOLE SHOOT RUNS SMOOTHER AND QUICKER IF EVERYONE CHIPS IN TO RESET THE STAGE WHEN A SHOOTER COMPLETES IT. PLEASE DO YOUR PART. DURING THE RESET TIME, THE RSO WILL BE AVAILABE TO THE CURRENT SHOOTER TO REVIEW THEIR EXECUTION OF THE SCENARIO, IF DESIRED BY THE SHOOTER. EXCEPT FOR TARGETS REQUIRING SPECIAL RESETING, RSOS WILL NOT BE RESETTING OR TAPING TARGETS OR PICKING UP BRASS.**
- 16. WHEN YOUR SQUAD COMPLETES A SCENARIO, AS THE LAST SQUAD TO SHOOT IT FOR THE DAY, PLEASE HELP WITH THE TEARDOWN AND STORAGE OF THE PROPS USED FOR THAT SCENARIO. YOUR HELP WITH TEARING DOWN OTHER COMPLETED SCENARIOS WOULD ALSO BE GREATLY APPRECIATED.**
